- 1. This shoot will be held at the Lake George Gun Club Inc. Range.
- 2. This Shoot is open to members from all gun clubs aged 18 and older. Junior club members will compete (1) in A Division up to 13, and (2) B Division for 14-17, under the direct supervision of an adult.
- 3. All shooters will register between 10:00 AM and 11:00 AM. The Shoot will be finished when all registered shooters have fired their targets.
- 4. Lever Action Rifle Shoot: Lever action centerfire repeating rifles are allowed for this shoot.
 - This shoot will have two classes: (A) Rifles with open or peep sights, and (B) Rifles with scope sights of any power.
 - No slings may be used for lever action competition.
- 5. Military Rifle Shoot: Standard issue centerfire military rifles are allowed in military rifle competition.
 - This shoot will have five classes: (A) Surplus Military Centerfire Rifles with Iron Sights, (B) Surplus Military Centerfire Rifles with Telescopic Sights, (C) Surplus Military Rimfire Rifles. Class C will have two subclasses: (C1) Iron Sights Class and (C2) Telescopic Sights Class (D) Contemporary Military Centerfire Rifle.
 - > Sporterized military stocks and legal length military barrels will be allowed.
 - > Different rifles may be used for each relay if desired.
 - Rifle slings may be used in the military shoot.
 - Only club issued front/forearm rests may be used.
- 6. Shooting relays will be conducted at the 50 yard range:
 - An optional 5 rounds may be fired for sight-in before competition rounds are fired.
 - > 10 rounds total will be fired for competition: 5 rounds fired from the benchrest position and 5 rounds fired from the standing, unsupported position.

 - (A) Under .30 calibre centerfire or rimfire magnum hunting rifles (barrel diameter of .75" or less at the muzzle).

 - (C) Any centerfire or rimfire magnum rifle and any scope.
 - (D) .22 rimfire sporting rifles (barrel diameter of .75" or under at the muzzle).

 - Open, peep or scope sights turned up to nine power will be used in classes A, B and D. Any power scopes and any rifle will be used in classes C and E.
 - All rifles shall have barrels of legal length or longer.
