RANGE STANDING ORDERS

(Updated May 2026)



1. All shooting conducted under the name of the Lake George Gun Club Inc. shall be carried out with the highest regard for safety and pride in the sport.
2. Shooting is permitted from 8:00 a.m. until dusk Monday to Saturday. No shooting activities are permitted on Sundays.
3. Upon arrival at the range, the status sign must be set to Range in Use. The red flag must be flown at all times when the range is active. The green flag and/or auditory siren indicates that people are down range.
4. The yellow flag must be flown if you are shooting forward of the main firing points. You must also be accompanied by another person acting as your range officer or safety observer.
5. No alcoholic beverages or recreational drugs are permitted on the premises. Shooters must not be under the influence of any such substances.
6. All entries and exits to the club building (except when going to or returning from the firing line) must be made through the side door. When the range is in use (red flag flying), members must not go under or over the back rope barriers. Members may only go past the forward rope barriers when utilizing the proper green or yellow flag indicators.
7. Club members and their guests must register in the Range Logbook upon arrival.
8. When two or more persons are shooting at the same time, one person must be designated as the range officer/safety observer. The designated range officer/safety observer may not shoot while performing this role. When three or more shooters are present, the designated range officer/safety observer must remain back from the firing positions to observe.

9. Eye and ear protection must be worn at all times during shooting activity.
10. Handgun shooting is permitted only at the 25-yard range and at the marked 50-yard position into the 100-yard backstop.
11. Field firing target clay shooting is permitted at the designated position forward of the main firing line. See posted regulations in the clubhouse for further information.
12. Designated shooting positions must be used for all shooting. Loading of firearms (including muzzleloaders) and magazines shall only occur at the firing line and only on the command of the range officer or designate. All rounds must be fired down range within the approved range template. No prohibited ammunition is permitted. No birdshot or pellets may be fired at the target frames—slug only.
13. No exploding or photorealistic targets are permitted. Metal/steel targets may be used only in compliance with New Brunswick regulations, which are posted in the clubhouse.
14. The green flag and/or auditory siren must be used before anyone goes down range to retrieve targets or perform maintenance. These signals indicate a cold range. They are not to be used when shooters are firing forward of the main firing line; in those cases, the yellow flag and a safety observer are required. When the green flag is flown, no firearms may be handled or brought to or from the firing line.
15. All non-shooting persons must remain behind the cease-fire line when the range is active. Coaches must stay with their assigned shooter until the range is no longer active. During competitions, only competitors, range officers, range officials, and coaches are permitted on the firing lines during shooting activities.
16. During competitions, the range officer or designate will call shooters to their positions. On non-competition days, if others are waiting to use the range, shooters will take their 30-minute turn in the order of signing the range logbook, unless the shooter whose turn it is chooses to pass.
17. On a cease-fire order, shooters must unload their firearms and place them open and safe in the shooting racks for inspection by the range officer or designate.

18. Firearms not on the firing line must be kept open, clear, and safe in the designated racks or in their transportation containers.
19. Targets must be retrieved; staples, pins, or other fasteners removed from the mats; and the backstops left clean when shooting is finished. Shooters must clean the firing points before leaving the range.
20. The range property must be left clean and securely locked before the last person leaves. If you have used the stove, you must refill the wood box.
21. All range rules, Standing Orders, and on-site instructions must be followed by everyone using the range. Members and their guests are responsible for familiarizing themselves with these requirements. Any observed safety concern, injury, damage, or significant occurrence must be reported *immediately* to the President, the Chief Range Officer, or another member of the Executive. Members also have a responsibility to inform the Executive of any routine maintenance concerns as soon as possible.
